SINDH ACT NO. XIV OF 2020

AN ACT

to reconstitute and reorganize the Centre of Excellence in Arts and Design, Mehran University of Engineering and Technology, Jamshoro as the Shaheed Allah Buksh Soomro University of Art, Design and Heritages, Jamshoro.

WHEREAS it is expedient to reconstitute and reorganize the Preamble. Centre of Excellence in Arts and Design, Mehran University of Engineering and Technology, Jamshoro as the Shaheed Allah Buksh Soomro University of Art, Design and Heritages, Jamshoro and to provide for the matters connected therewith or ancillary thereto;

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

CHAPTER-I PRELIMINARY

(1) This Act may be called the Shaheed Aliah Buksh Soomro Short title and University of Art, Design and Heritages Jamshoro, Act, 2020. commencement.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

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In this Act unless there is anything repugnant in the subject Definitions. or context -

- (a)"Academic Council" means the Academic Council of the University:
- (b)"affiliated college" means a College affiliated to the University;
- (c) "Authority" means any of the Authorities of the University specified in section 22;

(d)"Chancellor" means the Chancellor of the University;

(e) "Chairman" means the head of a Teaching department;

- (f) "Chief Minister" means the Chief Minister of Sindh;
- (g) "College" means a constituent college or an affiliated college;
- (h)"Commission" means the Sindh Higher Education Commission established under the Sindh Higher Education Commission Act, 2013 (Sindh Act No.XI of 2013);
- (i) "constituent college" means a college maintained and administered by the University;

(j)"Department" means the Universities and Boards Department, Sindh;

- (k)"Dean" means the Head of a Faculty;
- (I) "Director" means the head of teaching division or an institute established as constituent institute by the University;
- Institution (m) "educational institution" means an Imparting instruction in a subject or subjects relating to a faculty;
- (n) "Faculty" means a Faculty of the University;
- (o)"Government" means the Government of Sindh;
- (p)"Higher Education Commission Pakistan" means the Commission established under Higher Education Commission Pakistan Ordinance 2002;
- (q) "Officer" means any of the officers of the University specified in section 9;
- (r) "prescribed" means prescribed by Statutes, Regulationsor Rules;

- (s) "Principal" means the Head of a college;
- (t) "Pro-Chancellor" means the Pro-Chancellor of the University;
- (u)"Pro Vice-Chancellor" means the Pro Vice-Chancellor of the University;
- (v) "Higher Education Commission" means the Sindh Higher Education Commission;
- (w) "Professor Emeritus" means a retired Professor working in the University in an honorary capacity;
- (x) "registered graduate" means -
 - a graduate of the University who has his name entered in the register maintained for this purpose; or
 - a graduate of any other University who ordinarily resides within the territorial jurisdiction of the University and has his name entered in the register maintained by the University for this purpose;
- (y) "Registrar" means the Registrar of the University;
- (z) "Research Officer" means a person engaged whole-time by the University for research and equivalent in rank to a university Teacher;
- (aa) "Senate" means the Senate of the University;
- (bb) "Statutes", "Regulations" and "Rules" mean respectively the Statutes. Regulations and Rules made or deemed to have been made under this Act;
- (cc) "Syndicate" means the Syndicate of the University;
- (dd) "Teachers" Include professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors and Lecturers engaged whole-time by the University or by the college for teaching degree, honours or post-graduate classes, and such other persons as may be declared to be Teachers by Regulations;
- (ee) "Teaching Department" means a Teaching Department established and maintained, or recognized by the University;
- (ff) "University" means the Shaheed Allah Buksh Soomro University of Art, Design and Heritages, Jamshoro;
- (gg) "Vice-Chancellor", means the Vice-Chancellor of the University;
- (hh) "Visiting teacher" means a teacher who is invited for teaching by the University for a short period.

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CHAPTER-II THE UNIVERSITY

(1) The University to be called the Shaheed Allah Buksh Scentro Incorporation. 3. University of Art, Design and Heritages, Jamshoro is established in accordance with the provisions of this Act.

- (2) The University shall consist of -
 - (i) the Chancellor;

(ii) the Pro-Chancellor;

- (iii) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (iv) the Pro-Vice Chancellor, Deans, Principals of the colleges, Directors of the constituent institutions, Chairman of Teaching Departments, Registrar, Director Finance, Deputy Director Finance, Resident Auditor, Controller of Examinations, Project Director, Director Planning and such other officers as may be prescribed;
- (y)the members of the Senate, the syndicate, the Academic -Council and other Authorities of the University;
- (vi) all University teachers; and
- Professors Emeritus; (vii)

Provided that the Chief Minister may set up in any educational institution or college under the control and management of the University and establish a Board of Governors under section 40, in lieu of the Officers and employees at the educational Institution or college.

- (3) The University shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal with power among others, to acquire, hold and dispose of any property both movable & immovable vesting in it and shall by the aforesaid name sue and be sued.
- (4) The University shall be competent to acquire and hold property, both movable and immovable, or lese, sell or otherwise transfer any moveable and immovable property which may have vested in or been acquired by it or enter into contract for the purpose of this Act.
- 4. (1). All properties and assets, rights and interests of whatever Assets and kind, used, enjoyed, possessed, owned or vested in, or held Liabilities and in trust by the Centre of Excellence in Arts and Design, Transfer of Staff. Mehran University of Engineering and Technology, Jamshoro and all liabilities legally subsisting against it immediately before the commencement of this Act, shall stand transferred to the University.
 - (2) All persons serving in the Centre of Excellence in Arts and Design, Mehran University of Engineering and Technology, Jamshoro in any capacity immediately before the commencement of this Act, shall, notwithstanding any law or terms and conditions of their service, stand transferred for service to the University on the terms and conditions as may be prescribed:

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Provided that such terms and conditions shall not be less favourable than the terms and conditions admissible to them immediately before their transfer.

The University shall have the powers-

Powers of the University.

- to provide for instructions and research in, and advancement and dissemination of knowledge of, Art, Architecture, Design and Herltages including training, research, demonstration, diploma, certificates and such other allied subjects as may be prescribed;
- to prescribe courses of studies to be taught in the University and colleges;
- to hold examinations and confer degrees for graduate and post graduate, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinction on person who have, under the prescribed conditions have been admitted to and passed its examinations under prescribed conditions;
- (iv) to confer honorary degrees or other academic distinctions on such person, in the prescribed manner;
- (v) to confer degrees on persons who have done independent research under prescribed conditions;
- (vi) to provide for teaching specified courses or training for persons not being the students of the College, grant certificates and diplomas to such persons;
- (vii) to affiliate or disaffiliate colleges in the prescribed manner;
- (viii) to admit educational institutions to its privileges or withdraw such privileges from them in the prescribed manner;
- to inspect colleges and other educational institutions affiliated or seeking affiliation with it;
- (x) to accept the examinations passed or the periods of study spent at other college or places of learning, as equivalent to examinations or periods of study in the University or withdraw such acceptance;
- (xl) to cooperate with other universities or public authorities in such manner and for such purposes as it may determine;
- (xii) to institute Professorships, Associate Professorships, Assistant Professorships and Lecturerships and any other posts and to appoint persons thereto;
- (xiii) to create posts for research, extension, administration and for any other posts and appoint persons thereto;
- (xiv) to recognize selected members of the teaching staff of affiliated colleges and educational institutions admitted to its privileges and such other persons as teachers as it may deem fit;

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- (xv) to institute and award fellowships, scholarships, bursaries, medals and prizes in the prescribed manner;
- (xvi) to establish Teaching Department, colleges, facilities, institutes, centers of excellence, museums, art galleries and other centers of learning for the development of teaching and research and make such arrangements for their maintenance, management and administration, as it may determine:
- (xvii) to control the residence of the students of the University and the colleges, institute and maintain halis of residence and approve or license any place as hostel or lodging of students;
- (xviii) to supervise and control the discipline of the students of the University and Colleges and promote the extracurricular and recreational activities of such students and made arrangements for promoting their health and general welfare;
- (xix) to take disciplinary action against, and impose penalty on students in the prescribed manner;
- (xx) to demand, charge and receive such fees and other payments as it may determine;
- (xxi) to make provision for research and advisory services and with these objects to enter into arrangements with other institutions or with public bodies under prescribed conditions;

(xxii) to enter into, carry out, vary or cancel contracts;

- (xxiii) to receive and manage property transforred, and grants, bequests, trusts, gifts, donations, endowments and other contributions made to the University, and invest any fund representing such property, grants, bequests, trusts, glfts, donations, endowments or contributions in such manner as it may deem fit;
- (xxiv) to provide for the printing and publication of research and other works; and
- (xxv)to do all such other acts or things, whether incidental to the power aforesaid or not, as may be necessary to further the objects of the College University as a place of education, learning and research, and as teaching, affiliating and examining body.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in any law, for the time Jurisdiction of (1)being in force, the University shall have jurisdiction within the limit of its campus and in respect of colleges in such areas within the Province of Sindh as may be notified by Government:

the University.

Provided that Government may, in consultation with the University, by general or special order modify the lurisdiction.

No educational institution imparting education in the field of (2) visual, performing arts, designs, archeology, culture and heritage, situated within the territorial limits of the University shall, save with the consent of the University and the sanction of Government, be associated in any way with or seek admission to the privileges of any other University.

The University may admit to its privileges under prescribed (3) conditions, an educational institution falling within the territorial limits of another university whether inside or . outside Pakistan, provided that the consent of such other University is first obtained.

(1) The University shall be open to all sexes and religion, race, University caste, creed, class or colour and no person shall be denied Open to all the privileges of the University on the grounds only of sex, religion, race, caste, creed, class or colour:

classes, creeds, etc.

Provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed to prevent religious instruction being given to the students in their own religious faiths in such manner as may be prescribed.

- Department with the approval of Chief Minister may (2) issue guidelines and principles with respect to admission in the University including its constituent colleges and constituent institutions.
- (3) The Academic Council shall frame admission policy in consonance with guidelines and principles.
- All recognized methods of teaching in various courses in the Teaching at the 8. (1) University or the Colleges shall be conducted in the University. prescribed manner, and it may include lectures, tutorials, discussions, seminars, demonstrations, practical work in laboratories, studios, workshop and other methods of instruction.
 - (2) The teaching in any prescribed course in the University or colleges shall be organized by such Authority as may be prescribed.
 - (3) The courses and the curricular for teaching in the colleges shall be such as may be prescribed; provided that at the level of Bachelors degree, in all faculties, a discipline to be called the Islamic and Pakistan Studies Discipline shall be compulsory for Muslim students, and non-Muslim students shall in lieu of such discipline have option to offer Ethics and Pakistan Studies.

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CHAPTER - III OFFICER OF THE UNIVERSITY

9. The following shall be the officers of the University:-

- the Chancellor; (1)
- (ii) the Pro Chancellor:
- the Vice Chancellor; (iii)
- the Pro Vice-chancellor; (iv)
- (v) the Deans;
- the Principals of the constituent colleges; (vi)
- (vil) the Directors;
- (viii) the Chairman of teaching departments;
- (Ix) the Registrar;
- (x) the Director Finance;
- (xi) the Controller of Examinations;
- (xll) the Chief Accountant;
- (xiii) the Bursar;
- (xiv) the Resident Auditor;
- (xv) The Director Planning & Development;
- (xvi) Librarian;
- (xvii) and such other persons as may be prescribed by the Regulations to be the officers of the University.
- 10. (1)The Governor of Sindh shall be the Chancellor of the Chancellor. University.

- (2) The Chancellor shall, when present, preside at Convocation of the University.
- (3) Every proposal to confer an honorary degree shall be subject to confirmation by the Chancellor.
- (4) If the Chief Minister is satisfied that the proceedings of any Authority are not in accordance with the provisions of this act, the statutes, the regulations, or the rules, he may, after calling upon such Authority to show cause why such proceedings should not be annulled, by order in writing, annul the proceedings.
- (5) The Chief Minister shall have the power to assent to such statutes as are required to be submitted to him by the senate or withhold assent and refer them back to the senate for reconsideration.
- The Chief Minister may remove any person from the (6) membership of any Authority If such person
 - has become of unsound mind; or (1)
 - (11) has been incapacitated to function as member of such Authority; or
 - (iii) has been convicted by a court of law of an offence involving moral turpitude.

Officers of the University

- The Chief Minister may, subject to the provisions of this (7)Act, delegate all or any of the powers and functions of any Authority, officer or employee of the University at its main campus, to any authority, officer, employee or any other person at its additional campus for the purpose of exercising such powers and performing such functions in relation to such additional campus, and for this propose the Chief Minister may create new posts or positions at the additional campus.
- The Chief Minister may cause an inspection or enquiry to Visitation. 11. (1) be made in respect of any affairs or matter directly or in directly concerned with the University and shall, from time to time, appoint such person or more persons for of carrying out to conduct such inspection of
 - the university, its buildings, laboratories, libraries, L. museum, workshops and equipment;
 - any institution college or hostel maintained or ii. recognized by or affiliated to the University;
 - the teaching and other work conducted by the iii. University; and
 - the conduct of examinations held by the University; iv.
 - (2) The Chief Minister shall, in every such case aforesaid, give notice to the Syndicate of his intention to cause an inspection or enquiry to be made, and Syndicate shall be entitled to be represented there-at.
 - (3)The Chief Minister shall communicate to the Syndicate his views with regard to the results of such inspection or enquiry and shall, after ascertain the views thereon of the Syndicate, advice the Syndicate on the action to be taken.
 - (4) The Syndicate shall communicate to the Chief Minister such action, if any, as has been taken or may be proposed to be taken upon the results of the inspection or inquiry within such time as may be specified by the Chief Minister.
 - (5) Where the Syndicate does not, within a specified time, taken action to the satisfaction of the Chief Minister, the Chief Minister may, after considering any explanation furnished or representation made by the Syndicate, issue such direction as he thinks fir, and the Vice Charlcellor shall comply with such directions.
 - The Pro-Chancellor of the University shall be the Pro-Chancellor. (1) Universities Boards Minister/Advisor, and Department, Sindh.
 - Should the Chancellor be incapacitated from acting as (2)such due to absence or any other cause, the Pro-Chancellor shall exercise all the powers and perform all the duties of the Chancellor.
 - There shall be a Vice Chancellor of the University who Vice-Chancellor. (1) shall be an eminent academic qualified to be full Professor

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and shall be appointed by the **Chief Minister** for a period of four years which may be extended for one more term only on such terms and conditions as the **Chief Minister** may determine.

- (2) The Professional and Academic qualifications, experience and age for the post of Vice Chancellor shall be as such as may be determined by the Chief Minister.
- (3) At any time when the office of the Vice Chancellor is vacant, or the Vice Chancellor is absent or is unable to perform the functions of his office due to illness or some other cause, the Chief Minister shall make such arrangements for the performance of the duties of the Vice-Chancellor.
- (4) The Chief Minister shall, in case of allegations of gross misconduct, inefficiency, corruption, violation of budgetary provisions, moral turpitude, maladministration and mismanagement, remove the Vice Chancellor, on the basis of substantiated enquiry committee after giving him an opportunity of show cause notice against such removal.
- (5) The Vice Chancellor may avail leave with the permission of Chief Minister or any other authority duly authorized by the Chief Minister.
- (1) The Vice Chancellor shall be the principal executive and academic officer of the University, and shall ensure that the provisions of this Act, the statutes, the rules and the regulations are faithfully observed in order to promote the general efficiency and good order of the University. He shall have all powers necessary for this purpose including administrative control over all officers, teachers and other employees of the University.
 - (2) The Vice Chancellor shall, in the absence of the Chancellor and Pro-Chancellor, preside at the Convocation of the University and the meetings of the Senate and shall, if present, preside at the meetings of the Authorities of which he is the Chairman and be entitled to attend and, if permissible preside at the meetings of any other Authority or body of the University.
 - (3) The Vice Chancellor may, in an emergency, which in his opinion requires immediate action, take such action as ne may consider necessary and shall, as soon thereafter as possible, report his action to the officer, authority or other body which in the ordinary course, would have dealt with the matter.
 - (4) The Vice Chancellor shall also have the powers -
 - to create and fill temporary posts for a period not exceeding six months;

Powers and Duties of the Vice chancelior.

- ii. to sanction all expenditure provided for in the approved budget, and to re-appropriate funds within the same major head of expenditure;
- ill, to sanction by re-appropriation an amount not exceeding two hundred thousand rupees for an unforeseen item not provided for in the budget, and report it to the Syndicate at the next meeting;
- iv. to appoint paper setters and examiners for all examinations of the University after receiving panels of names from the relevant authorities;
- v. to make such arrangements for the scrutiny of papers, marks and results as may be necessary;
- to direct teachers, officers and other employees of vi. the University to take up such assignments in connection with teaching, research, examination, administration and such other activities in the University as the may consider necessary for the purpose of University:
- vil. to delegate, subject to such conditions, if any, as may be prescribed, any of his powers under this Act to an officer or officers of the University;
- vili. to exercise general control supervision over the system of examination in the University;
- ix. appoint employees of such categories in respect of which powers have been delegated to him by the Syndicate;
- x. to exercise and perform such other powers and . functions as may be prescribed; and
- xi. to make appointments to the posts in all grades of the Basic Scales of pay up to grade 16.
- 15. (1)The Pro-Vice Chancellor shall be from amongst University Professors to be appointed by the Chief Minister for the main campus or of the additional campus, if any, or for both the campuses jointly or separately, on such terms and conditions and for such period not exceeding four years at time as may be determined by the Chief Minister.
 - Where a Pro-Vice Chancellor is appointed under sub-(2) section,(1), he shall, notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, exercise such powers and perform such functions of the Vice Chancellor or such other powers and functions, in respect of the campus for which he is appointed, as the Chief Minister may delegate to him.
 - (3) The Pro-Vice Chancellor, if appointed, shall be ex-officio member of the Senate, Syndicate and Academic Council.
- 16. (1) The Registrar shall be a whole-time officer of the Registrar. University and shall be appointed by the Syndicate on the recommendations of the Selection Board, on such terms and conditions as it may determine

Pro-Vice Chancellor.

- (2) . The Registrar shall -
 - (a) hold office for a period of three years on the expiry of which he shall be eligible for re-appointment;
 - (b) be the custodian of the common seal and the academic records of the University;
 - (c) maintain a register of registered graduates in the prescribed manner;
 - (d) conduct election of members to the various authorities in the prescribed manner: and
 - (e) perform such other duties as may be prescribed

17. (1)

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The Director of Finance shall be a whole-time office: of the University and shall be appointed by the Chief Minister from a panel of three candidates recommended by the Syndicate on such terms and conditions as it may determine.

Director of Finance. .

- The Director Finance shall -(2)
 - (a) manage the property, finances and the investments of the University;
 - (b) be the Chief Finance officer of the University;
 - (c) prepare the annual and revised budget estimates of the University and present them to the Finance. Committee, the Syndicate and the Senate,
 - (d) ensure that the funds of the University are expended for the purposes for which they are provided; an
 - (e) perform such other duties as may be prescribed.
- (3) The experience as well as professional and academic qualifications for the post of Director of Finance shall be such as may be prescribed.
- The Director of Finance shall be assisted by the Chier (4) Accountant, Bursar and the Resident Auditor.

The Controller of Examinations shall be a whole time officer Controller of of the University and shall be appointed by Syndicate on the recommendations of the Selection Board on such terms and conditions as it may determine. He shall be responsible for all matters connected with the conduct of examinations and perform such other duties as may be prescribed.

- The Chief Accountant, Bursar and Resident Auditor shall be The Chief 19. (1) whole-time officers of the University and shall be appointed by the Syndicate on the recommendations of the Selection Board on such terms and conditions as it may determine.
 - The Resident Auditor shall be whole-time officer of the (2) University and shall be appointed by the Pro-Chancellor who shall be a Cabinet Minister on such terms and conditions as it may determine. He shall be responsible for all matters connected with the auditing of accounts of the University and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed.

Examinations.

Accountant, Bursar and **Resident Auditor.** The Director Planning and Development shall be wholetime officer of the University and shall be appointed by the Syndicate on the recommendations of the Selection Board on such terms and conditions as it may determine. He shall be responsible for the planning and development of the University and shall present the development plans and proposals to the Finance and Planning Committee and other relevant authorities of the University.

All the other remaining officers mentioned in section 9, shall be appointed by such officer or authority as authorized by Government on such terms and conditions as it may determine. They shall perform their duties as may be prescribed.

- 23. (1) The Senate shall consist of-

i) the Chief Minister;

- ii) the Pro-Chancellor;
- iii) the Vice-Chancellor;
- iv) the Pro-Vice Chancellor, if appointed;
- v) the Members of the Syndicate;
- vi) the Deans;
- vii) the Directors;
- viii) the Principals of the constituent colleges;
- ix) the University Professors and Professors Emeritus;
- x) the Chairmen of the Teaching Departments;
- xl) the Officer or Teacher In charge of Student Affairs (by whatever designation called);
- xii) three Principals of affiliated colleges to be elected by the Principals of all such colleges from amongst themselves;
- xiii) the Chairman Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education located within the jurisdiction of the University;

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- xiv) the Chairman, Board of Technical Education;
- xv) twelve University teachers having at least three years' service to be elected by all University teachers;

- xviii) the Registrar;
- xix) the Director of Finance;
- XX) the Controller of Examination:
- the Librarian: xxi)
- The Chief Minister or in his absence, the Pro-Chancellor (2)or in absence of both, the Vice-Chancellor shall be the Chairman of the Senate.
- (3) The members of the Senate, other than ex-officio members shall hold office for three years.
- (4) The Senate shall meet at least twice in every year on dates to be fixed by the Vice Chancellor with the consent of the Chief Minister.
- (5) The quorum for a meeting of the Senate shall be onethird of the total number of members, a fraction being counted as one.
 - Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Senate shall have Power and duties the powers to -
 - (a) consider the drafts of statutes proposed by the Syndicate and dispose of them in the manner indicated in sub-section (2) of section 31;
 - (b) consider and pass resolution on the annual report, the annual statement of accounts, and the annual and revised budget estimates;
 - (c) appoint members to the Syndicate and other Authorities in accordance with the provisions of this. Act;
 - (d) delegate any of its powers to an Authority or Officer or a Committee or Sub-Committee; and
 - (e) perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the statutes.

- (xv) one Principal of an affiliated college, if any, and the Principals of constituent colleges to the extent of the matters relevant to the concerned constituent college to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor;
- (xvi) one Alim and one woman not serving in any educational institution to be nominated by the Chief Minister;
- (xvii) one University officer of Administration side, to be elected from amongst all administrative officers.

CHAPTER-VII **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

An officer, teacher or other employee of the University Retirement from service. shall retire from the service of the University

(i) on such date, after he has completed twenty five years service qualitying for pension or other retirement benefits, as the competent authority may direct:

Provided that no employee shall be retired unless he has been informed in writing of the grounds of the action proposed to be taken against him and has been given reasonable opportunity of showing cause against that action; or

(ii) where no direction is given under clause (i), on the completion of sixty years age.

Explanation .- In this section "competent authority" means the appointing authority or a person duly authorized by the appointing authority in that behalf, not being a person lower in rank to the officer, teacher or other employee concerned.

Except as otherwise provided in this Act, no officer, Opportunity to teacher or other employee of the University holding a show cause. permanent post shall be reduced in rank, or removed or compulsorily retired from service, unless he has been given reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken against him.

 - (d) three teachers to be nominated by the Academic Council by reason of their specialized knowledge of subjects which, though not assigned to the Faculty, have in the opinion of the Academic Council, important bearing on the subjects assigned to the Faculty.
- (4) The members mentioned in sub-clauses (c) and (d) of clause (3) shall hold office for three years.
- (5) The quorum for a meeting of the Board of a Faculty shall be one-half of the total number of members, a fraction being counted as one.
- (6) The Board of each Faculty shall, subject to the general control of the Academic Council and the Syndicate, have the powers -
 - (a) to coordinate the teaching and research work in the subject assigned to the Faculty;
 - (b) to scrutinize the recommendations of the Board of Studies comprised in the Faculty, on the appointment of paper setters and examiners, except for research examiners and forward them to the vice Chancellor;
 - (c) to consider any other academic matter relating to the Faculty and to report thereon to the Academic Council; and .
 - (d) to perform such other functions as may be prescribed

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- (1) There shall be a Dean of each Faculty who shall be the. Dean. Chairman and convener of the Board of Faculty.
 - The Dean of each Faculty shall be appointed by the Chief (2)Minister on the recommendations of the Vice Chancellor from amongst the three most senior Professors in the Faculty for a period of three years.
 - (3)The Dean shall present candidates for admission to degree, except honorary degrees, in the courses falling within the purview of the Faculty.
 - The Dean shall exercise such other powers and perform (4)such other duties as may be prescribed.
- There shall be a Teaching Department for each subject or Teaching (1) a group of subjects as may be prescribed by regulations Department. and each Teaching Department shall be headed by a Chairman.
 - The Chairman of the Teaching Department shall be (2) appointed by the Syndicate on the recommendations ofthe Vice Chancellor from amongst three most senior Professors or Associate Professors of the Department for a period of three years:

Provided that where there is no Professor or Associate in a Department, it shall be looked after by the Dean of the Faculty with the assistance of the most senior teacher of the Department."

- (3) The Chairman of the Teaching Department shall plan, organize and supervise the work of the Department in accordance, with the provisions of this Act and shall be responsible to the Dean of the Faculty in which his Department is comprised for the work of his Department.
- There shall be a separate Board of Studies for each, Boards of (1). subject or group of subjects, as may be prescribed by the Studies. regulations.

- Each Board of Studies shall consist of-(2)
 - (a) the Chairman of the Teaching Department;
 - (b) all Professors and Associate Professors in the Teaching Department concerned;
 - (c) three Assistant Professors and one lecturer to be appointed by rotation in order of seniority from the Department concerned;
 - (d) three teachers other than the teachers to be appointed by the Syndicate. The number will be determined by the Syndicate according to the needs of each Board;
 - (e) one expert to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor; and
 - one representative of the teachers of each affiliated college teaching at graduate and (1) postgraduate levels in that subject to be nominated by the Academic Council.

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2.

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- (3) The term of office of members of the Board of Studies other than ex-officio members shall be three years.
- (4) The quorum for meetings of the Board of Studies shall be one-half of the total number of members, a fraction being counted as one.
- (5) The Chairman of the Teaching Department concerned shall be the Chairman and convener of the Board of Studies. Where in respect of a subject there is no Teaching Department, the Chairman shall be appointed by the Syndicate.

(6) The functions of the Board of Studies shall be -

- (a) to advise the Authonities on all academic matters connected with instruction, research and examination in the subject or subjects concerned;
- (b) to propose curricula and syllabilition all degree, diploma and certificate courses in the subject or subjects concerned;
- to suggest a panel of names of paper-setters and examiners in the subject or subjects concerned; and
- (d) to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by regulations.
- The Advanced Studies and Research Board shall consist Advanced of - Studies and
 - (i) the Vice Chancellor (Chairman);
 - (ii) the Deans;
 - (iii) three University Professors other than Deans to be appointed by the Syndicate;
 - (iv) three University Teachers having research qualifications and experience to be appointed by the Academic Council; and
 - (v) the Professors Emeritus.
 - (2) The term of office of members of the Advanced Studies and Research Board other than ex-officio members shall be three years.
 - (3) The quorum for a meeting of the Advanced Studies and Research Board shall be one-half of the total number of members, a fraction being counted as one.
 - (4) The functions of the Advanced Studies and Research Board shall be -
 - (a) to advise the Authorities on all matters connected with the promotion or advanced studies and research in the University;
 - (b) to consider and report to the Authorities on the institution of research degrees in the University;
 - to propose regulations regarding the award of research degrees;

Advanced Studies and Research Board.

- (d) to appoint supervisors for research students and to determine the subjects of their thesis;
- (e) to recommend panels of names of paper setters and examiners for research examinations after considering the proposals of the Board of Studies in this behalf; and
- (f) to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the statutes.
- (1) The Selection Board shall consist of

Selection Board.

- (i) the Vice Chancellor (Chairman);
- (ii) "the Chairman, or a member of the Sindh Public Service Commission to be appointed by the Chairman;
- (iii) the Secretary Universities and Boards;
- (iv) one member of the Syndicate and two other persons of eminence to be nominated by the Syndicate; provided that none of them is an employee of the University;
- (v) Dean of the Faculty concerned; and
- (vi) the Chairman of the Teaching Department concerned.
- (2) The members mentioned in sub-clause (iv) of clause (1) shall hold office for two years.
- (3) The quorum for meeting of the Selection Board shall be four members.
- (4) No member of the Selection Board who is a candidate for the post to which appointment is to be made shall take part in the proceeding of the Selection Board.
- (5) In selecting candidates for the posts of Professors and Associate Professors, the Selection Board shall co-opt or consult three experts in the subject concerned, and in selecting candidates for other teaching posts, two experts in the subject concerned, to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor, from a standing list of experts for each subject approved by the Syndicate on the recommendation of the Selection Board and revised from time to time.
- (1) The Selection Board shall consider the applications for teaching and other posts received in response to an advertisement and shall recommend to the Syndicate the names of suitable candidates for appointment to such posts.
- (2) The Selection Board may recommend the grant of a higher initial pay in a suitable case for reasons to be recorded.

Functions of Selection Board.

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- The Selection Board may recommend to the Syndicate (3) the appointment of an eminently qualified person to a Professorship in the University on the terms and conditions other than those prescribed.
- The Selection Board shall consider all cases of promotion (4) of officers of the University and recommend to the Syndicate the names of suitable candidates as may be prescribed.
- In the event of an unresolved difference of opinion (5) between the Selection Board and the Syndicate, the matter shall be referred to the Chief Minister whose decision shall be final.

Finance and Planning Committee Finance and There shall be (1) consisting of -

Planning Committee.

- (i) in case of the main campus -
 - (a) the Vice-Chancellor who shall be the Chairman;
 - (b) one member of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate;
 - one member of the Syndicate to be appointed (c) to be appointed by the Syndicate;
 - one representative each from Universities and (d) Boards Department and Finance Department not below the rank of Deputy Secretary;
 - two Deans to be nominated by the Chief (e) Minister on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor;
 - one nominee of the Sindh Higher Education, (f) Commission; and
 - the Director of Finance who shall act as (9) Secretary:
- (ii) in case of additional campus
 - the Pro-Vice Chancellor (Chairman); (a)
 - (b) two Chairmen of the Teaching Departments to be nominated by the Pro-Vice Chancellor where there is a Board of Governors, by such Board;-
 - one nominee of the Vice Chancellor; (c)
 - (d) one nominee of the Sindh Higher Education Commission; and

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- (e) the Director Finance.
- (2)
 - The term of office of the members of the Finance and Planning Committee other than ex-officio members shall be three years.

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(3) The guorum for a meeting of the Finance and Planning Committee shall be three members.

The functions of the Finance and Planning Committee shall be -

- to consider the annual statement of accounts and the annual and revised budget estimates and advise the Syndicate thereon;
- (b) to review periodically the financial position of the University;
- (c) to advise the Syndicate on all matters relating to planning, development, finances, investments and accounts of the University;
- (d) to prepare short term and long term development plans; and
- to perform such other functions as may be prescribed.

(1) There shall be an Affiliation Committee consisting of -

Affiliation Committee.

- (i) the Vice-Chancellor who shall be the Chaliman;
- one member of the Syndicate to be nominated by the Syndicate; and
- (iii) two Professors to be nominated by the Academic Council.
- (iv) the Director Education (Colleges) of the region concerned.
- (2) The term of office of the appointed members of the Committee excluding ex-officio members shall be two years.
- (3) The Affiliation Committee may co-opt not more than three experts.
- (4) The quorum of meeting or an inspection by the affiliation committee shall be three members.
- (5) An officer of the University to be designated by the Vice Chancellor for this purpose shall act as the Secretary of the Committee.
- (6) The functions of the Affiliation Committee shall be -
 - (a) to inspect the educational institutions seeking affiliation with or admission to the privileges of the University and to advise the Academic Council thereon;
 - (b) to enquire into the complaints alleging breach of conditions of affiliation by affiliated colleges and to advise the Academic Council thereon; and

Functions of the Finance and Planning

Committee.

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- (c) to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by Regulations.
- (1) The Disciplinary Committee shall consist of -

Disciplinary Committee.

- (a) the Vice-Chancellor or his nominee;
- (b) two Professors to be nominated by the Academic Council;
- (c) one member to be nominated by the Syndicate; and
- (d) The Teacher or Officer in-charge of Students Affairs by whatever name called (Member-Secretary).
- (2) The term of office of the members of the Disciplinary Committee, excluding ex-officio members, shall be two years.
- (3) The quorum for a meeting of the Disciplinary Committee shall be four members.
- (4) The functions of the Disciplinary Committee Shall be -
 - to propose regulations to the Academic Council for the conduct of University students, maintenance of discipline and for dealing with cases of indiscipline; and
 - (ii) to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the regulations.
