

**SIND ORDINANCE NO.II OF 1985.**

**THE SUGAR FACTORIES CONTROL (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1985.**

[19<sup>th</sup> February, 1985].

An Ordinance to amend the Sugar Factories Control Act, 1950, as applicable to Sind.

**WHEREAS** it is expedient to amend the Sugar Factories Control Act, 1950, as applicable to Sind in the manner hereinafter appearing; **Preamble.**

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in pursuance of the Proclamation of the fifth day of July, 1977, and the Provisional Constitution Order, 1981, the Governor of Sind is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance :-

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Sugar Factories Control (Amendment) Ordinance, 1985. **Short title and commencement.**

(2) It shall come into force at-once.

2. In the Sugar Factories Control Act, 1950, as applicable to Sind, hereinafter referred to as the said Act, in section 16, after sub-section (iv), the following new sub-section shall be added:-- **Amendment of section 16 of NWFP Act XXII of 1950.**

“(v) The Provincial Government may direct the Factories to pay quality premium at the end of the crushing season at such rate as may be specified the by Provincial Government in proportion to the sucrose recovery of each factory in excess of base level sucrose contents determined by the Provincial Government, from time to time.”.

3. In the said Act, in section 21, for sub-section (a), the following shall be substituted:- **Amendment of section 21 of WFP Act XXII of 1950.**

“21. (a) Any person contravening the provisions of this Act, except the provisions of section 16, or any order or rule made thereunder shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to twelve months or with fine which may extend to fifteen thousand rupees or with both.

(aa) Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of section 16 or any directions issued thereunder shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years, or with fine upto twice the price of the sugar cane or quality premium, as the case may be.".
